### Community Speed Watch

Since our last newsletter we have been continuing to carry out regular speed watches with our PCSO Karen Pykett and her colleagues. These have revealed some disturbing results with vehicles entering our village in excess of 45 mph within the 30mph speed limit. This reaffirms the speeding issues that we have within our village.

Carrying out monthly speed Watches not only collates valuable evidence but also results in warning notices being issued to the offending drivers and demonstrates a police presence in the village.

## **PLANNING APPLICATIONS**

### **Trees**

We would like to inform you of the regulations regarding trees within our village, as some residents may not be aware. All trees within the conservation area are under protection with a maximum fine of £20,000 if pruned or taken down without the relevant planning application being granted. There are a number of trees within the village with Tree Preservation Orders and you can access the map and information for these by going on the Erewash Borough Council website ( [www.erewash.gov.uk](http://www.erewash.gov.uk)) and entering Erewash mapping in the search box.

### **Properties**

We would also like to remind residents that as we are a conservation village any alterations to properties or land must have the relevant planning application approval. Whether it be an extension or any kind of change to the exterior including fencing and walls. We would recommend that you seek professional advice prior to commencing any works.

### **Dog Fouling**

It has been noticed that there has been an increase in dog fouling within our village. As many residents are proud dog owners and very much respect our village there maybe visitors who may not be aware of where our appropriate bins are located. The local dog warden has provided some flyers, posters and we have managed to obtain bags to help try to prevent dog fouling within our village. We are looking into promoting an amnesty regarding dog fouling but also would like to thank all dog walkers who do respect our village and make sure that our green spaces, paths and pavements are clear of any dog foul.
